

SHIP WATCH LIST

The Ship Watch List lists the ships which have been detained for three or more times by the BS MOU during the last 24 months. Listed ships, which will be referred as "watch list member" on the Black Sea Information System (BSIS), will be under continuous watch of the PSCO and will be subjected to more frequent inspections, once in a month if they are in the port within the Black Sea MOU region. The list is in descending order of the number of times a ship was detained in the BS MOU region in the period under review. The factual information in this list (Ship Name, Flag, Company) pertains to the situation at the time of last detention which took place during the period.
